Since 1960, the Ceylon Fellowship of Service Prithipura Home has flourished in tranquil surroundings on four acres of land in the coastal town of Wattala.

The Ceylon Fellowship of Service Prithipura Home was inaugurated in 1962. Under the guidance and dedication of Bikkhu Sumana, the Home initially began as a boys' home. There were three huts with cemented floors, wooden walls and thatch roofs. It had four residents with a few house mothers to care for them.

Today there are 61 residents housed in six cottages on the premises, giving the feeling of an extended family unit. Four cottages - Norad, Canada, Jayewardene and Rosy - house male residents while the females live in Bates and Prithi. Our staff numbers nine house mothers, three kitchen staff, a matron, an administration officer, a gate keeper, a gardener and a driver.

Our mission is to care for the residents in a community environment that enables them to live life to the fullest. We offer a safe place for the well-being and rehabilitation of the residents who need special care and attention due to mental, physical, social or economic reasons. At the Home, residents are encouraged to develop their own personalities and identities.

Economic Crisis Brings Many Challenges

Rising prices and diminishing donations in terms of danes and dry rations continued to impact on the Home. The ever increasing costs of meals, maintenance and repairs as well as regular medicines are placing a strain on finances. However, with the help of generous international and local donors, the Home was able to continue to look after the welfare of its residents and to provide for their needs.

Local institutions including the Wattala Navy Camp, NDB bank and LOLC in Wattala continued to help the Home with shramadanas and by providing dry rations and gifts to the residents.

We have been able to upgrade the toilets of four cottages and the other two toilets will be done in 2023. The activity room is to be upgraded. There are plans to look at the overall picture of buildings in the Home to ensure they are used to full capacity after some renovations and repairs.

The residents and staff continued to do their part by growing vegetables and fruit, which is used by kitchen staff in preparing food for the Home.

After many bureaucratic hurdles we were able to get the Home listed as an Approved Charity by the Inland Revenue Department by gazette no 2288-09 of 12th July 2022 and CFS is now appearing on their website as an Approved Charity, which will be of use to donors who want to claim tax deductions on their donations.

Despite the challenges, we are carrying on and we look forward to a brighter future for the residents and staff in the coming year.

The manager of the Home resigned at the end of August and the administration officer resigned i December. A new administration officer joined us in November.

In November, president Joan Jayamanne stepped down for personal reasons and a new president, Devika Anthonisz was appointed the new president from December 2022. Sunethra Fernando took over as treasurer.

Tashya de Silva, Nirodha Cooray and T. Someswaran resigned from the committee.
